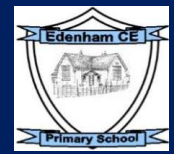

Easter Jigsaw Hunt

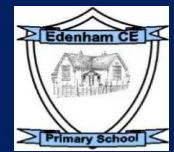

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This week's superstars

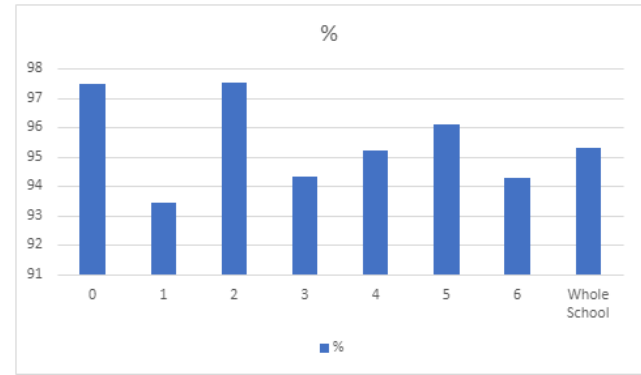

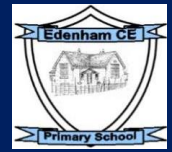
Finally we would like to wish you a Happy Easter, we hope you find time to rest, reflect and spend time with your loved ones.
