Art and design	<p>Create a piece of artwork that celebrates the Eiffel Tower. You could use Georges Seurat's dot-style painting as inspiration!</p> 	<p>Design and create your own version of Pajaki – Polish Folk Art – using symmetrical patterns and designs.</p> 	<p>Use cardboard to create your own Eiffel Tower model.</p> 
Maths / English	<p>Write a set of instructions about how to create one of the pieces of artwork above. Remember to include an equipment list and a precise set of directions on how to create the finished project!</p>	<p>Using your learning about Paris, write your own narrative set in the capital city of France. You could write an adventure story or even an exciting mystery!</p>	<p>Research the height of the Eiffel Tower in metres. Answer the following questions based on each number:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. If the Eiffel Tower was made 6 times bigger, how tall would it be? 2. How tall would the Eiffel Tower be if it was 3 times smaller? 3. How tall is the Eiffel Tower in centimetres? 4. How tall would the Eiffel Tower be in a scale model where 1 cm represents 10 meters? 5. The Statue of Liberty in New York is about 93 meters tall. How many Statues of Liberty would need to

			be stacked to match the height of the Eiffel Tower?
Big Questions (demonstrate your answers to these however you see fit)	<p>Research are some famous people from Poland (like scientists, artists, musicians, or athletes), and answer the question: How have they influenced the world?</p> <p>Present your findings in the most creative way that you can!</p>	<p>How does the Eiffel Tower compare to other famous structures?</p> <p>You could consider researching the Statue of Liberty or the Leaning Tower of Piza, for example.</p> <p>How do they compare? What do they have in common and what makes them different? How have they impacted society?</p>	<p>What do you think the Eiffel tower look like and be used for in 100 years?</p> <p>Consider how it might be impacted by technology, how it could be used to benefit people's lives, or how the visitor experience could change.</p>
