




Blackman Class – Autumn term 3

Art and design	<p>Design a bridge that crosses the River Thames. Things to consider: What will the bridge be used for? What materials will be used? What different parts will the bridge have?</p> 	<p>Seaside holiday trips became very popular among the rich. Research holiday advert posters from this period and create one of your own for a seaside venue you love.</p> 	<p>Research what Victorian toys children played with. Do we play any games that are similar?</p> <p>Design or create your own toy using the resources available to Victorian toy makers e.g. wood, string.</p> 
Maths / English	<p>What was life like for a Victorian child during the Industrial Revolution?</p> <p>Create a fact file with information about jobs, leisure and school.</p> <p>You could present your findings in a creative way with fact boxes and images!</p>	<p>Write a diary entry from the perspective of a child living during the Industrial Revolution.</p> <p>Imagine the environment that you might have to live in and work in.</p> <p>What can you see, smell or hear? Who are you working with? What are the working conditions like? Who do you miss?</p>	<p>Create a timeline of key events that took place during the Industrial Revolution.</p> <p>Carry out some research and choose at least 5 events to include on your timeline.</p> <p>Challenge: Choose one of your events and explain how this event has changed how we live our lives now.</p>
