Maths	Can you plan your own journey overseas? Can you decide where you are traveling from and to? What transport you are using and how much time it would take?	Make a fact file about Nellie Bly and her journey around the world . Make sure to include some key figures.	Can you make a timetable of a journey you have taken using analogue times? e.g., to school, going to seaside.
English	Can you write a diary entry about a journey you have taken? Can you describe how you felt and what you might have seen?	Make a booklet for a continent. What countries are part of this continent? What are the famous landmarks?	Write an acrostic poem using the letters from the word JOURNEY
Big Question	Make a map showing the journey of Nellie Bly as she travelled round the world in 72 days.	Create a collage or painting of the famous journey of Floella Benjamin travelling aboard a ship bound for England from the Caribbean or the Arctic adventures of Ernest Shackleton.	Create a globe of the world. (A balloon and paper mache work well for this.)
